










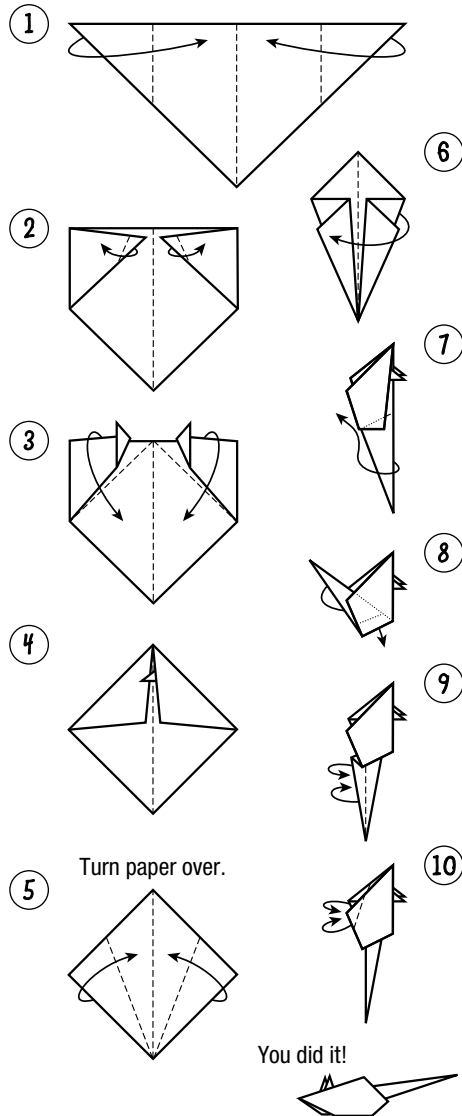
Fast Facts About Biomedical Research

-  Between 10 and 17 million dogs and cats are euthanized in pounds and shelters annually.
-  Approximately 1.1% of dogs and cats that would otherwise be put to death in pounds and shelters are used in research.
-  Rats, mice, and other rodents comprise 85–95% of all animals used in research.
-  Primates make up about 1/3 of 1% of animals used in the United States for research.
-  The majority of animals used in biomedical research are bred specifically for that purpose by USDA licensed suppliers.
-  The number of animal models used for biomedical research has annually declined 40% since 1968.
-  An estimated 17 to 22 million vertebrate animals are used each year in research.
-  Humans now live an additional 20.8 years because of the discoveries made from biomedical research.
