#### KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

##### **Radford W. Jones**

Rad Jones retired from the U.S. Secret Service in 1983 as the Special Agent in Charge of the Detroit Office. Currently he is an Academic Specialist in the School of Criminal Justice, Michigan State University. Rad is engaged in community outreach and is the director of the School's Masters of Science Criminal Justice Internet degree program.

Rad directed a Department of Homeland Security, Office of Domestic Preparedness grant that resulted in the publication of the *Critical Incident Protocol – A Public and Private Partnership*. He is currently directing an ODP grant working with communities to develop joint public/private sector disaster planning, including weapons of mass destruction. He is also directing a project with the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) to develop a WMD training program for police chiefs and senior executives.

In 1997, Rad retired from Ford Motor Company as the manager of Security and Fire Protection where he was responsible for the development and implementation of global security and fire programs. He has made presentations on disaster management, travel security and asset protection related topics around the world, and written articles for the Police Chief, Security Management and other publications.

##### **Robert C. Tarrant**

Bob Tarrant is Emergency Management Coordinator for the Michigan Department of Agriculture. In this role he is responsible for coordinating MDA activities related to preparing for and responding to large-scale emergencies or disasters.

In 1998, Bob retired from the Michigan State Police after 25 years of service. At retirement, he was Commander of the Emergency Management Division and Deputy State Director of Emergency Management. Bob was responsible for state and local government planning, preparedness, response, and recovery from large-scale emergencies and disasters. He advised the Governor and coordinated all federal, state, and local resources during times of disaster. Bob was Chair of both Michigan's Emergency Response and Community Right to Know Commission and the Michigan Task Force on Terrorism and Weapons of Mass Destruction.

Prior to accepting his current position at the Department of Agriculture, Bob worked with the Michigan State University School of Criminal Justice in emergency management projects including the development of *Critical Incident Protocol – A Public and Private Partnership*. Bob has also provided consulting services related to emergency preparedness and response to both public and private sector clients through his firm, Tarrant and Associates, Inc.
